Connecticut to Virginia, and before he joined the team at The Brick, he spent almost three years as the Sous Chef at Jessup's Tavern.

Another talented chef who will showcase his skills at the event is Chef Ryan Cunningham, who received his Culinary Arts Degree from Johnson & Wales University in 2000. After spending time at Fusion, Nage, and Bonz Steakhouse, Cunningham joined forces with Kevin Reading to open Abbott's Grill in 2009. As Executive Chef at Abbott's on Broad Creek, Cunningham focuses on putting his own unique spin on New American dishes, using fresh flavors and classic French technique.
